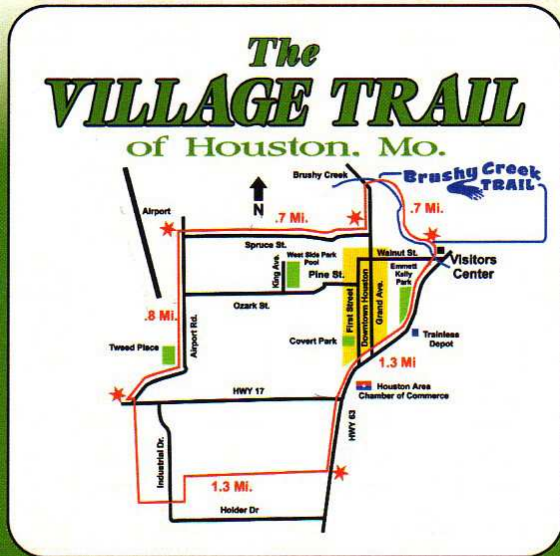

Hiking/ Walking	The Brushy Creek Trail is approximately .3 miles long and suitable for walking and hiking. It takes from 30 - 45 minutes to walk to the end of the path and back to the trailhead.
Native Wildlife Viewing	During your walks, we would encourage you to bring your camera for those rare wildlife pictures of animals, butterflies, wildflowers and birds.
